3. The award shall be based on the actions demonstrating outstanding work and service relating to the ideals and objectives of Circle K-service, leadership, and fellowship.
4. An essay shall be prepared by the club describing the individual's contributions to the club and what makes this officer outstanding as per the characteristics outlined in #3. Essays shall be typed on an 8 1/2" x 11" (with 1" margins) sheet of white paper and shall not exceed 1 page double-spaced in length.
5. This entry form must be signed by the individuals as indicated and submitted with your club's essay **before the end of Registration on the Friday night of Convention.**
6. First, Second, and Third place awards will be presented. All decisions of the judges are final.

3. The award shall be based on the actions demonstrating outstanding work in service, leadership and fellowship within Circle K International.
2. A typed award nomination should be submitted on an 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of white paper (with 1" margins) in 12 point font detailing how this member has demonstrated outstanding work in service, leadership and fellowship within Circle K International. The award nomination should not exceed one page double-spaced in length.
3. The award nomination should be presented in paragraph form under the following headings. At least three concrete examples of each area should be included from this past administrative year.
 - Service (34%)
 - Leadership (33%)
 - Fellowship (33%)
4. This entry form must be signed by the individuals as indicated and submitted with your club's essay **before the end of Registration on the Friday night of Convention.**
5. First, Second, and Third place awards will be presented only if suitable applications are received. Failure to comply to with award criteria will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.

Rules Governing the Past Governors' Award:

1. Any member in good standing with the New England District of Circle K may nominate one member for the Past Governors' Award. Said entrant must be a graduating senior in good standing with the New England District of Circle K for the past four years.
2. A typed award nomination should be submitted on an 8 1/2" x 11" sheet of white paper (with 1" margins) double-spaced in 12 point font. Detailing how this Circle Ker has demonstrated the three major aspects of Circle K: service, leadership, and fellowship throughout his/her four or more years in Circle K. The award nomination should not exceed more than four pages in length.
3. The award nomination should be presented in paragraph form under the following headings. At least five concrete examples of service, leadership, and fellowship should be included.
 - Service (30%)
 - Leadership (30%)
 - Fellowship (30%)
 - Kiwanis Family experience (10%)
4. This entry form, signed by the nominator as factually correct, **shall be submitted with your essay before the end of Registration on the Friday night of Convention.**
4. Only one award will be given each year only if suitable applications are received. Failure to comply to with award criteria will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.
5. The New England District Board will judge the Past Governors' Award. Only one award will be given each year. If no suitable candidate is submitted, then no award will be presented. Failure to comply to with award criteria will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.

Should not exceed two pages double-spaced in length.
3. The award nomination should be presented in paragraph form under the following headings:
 - Attendance at Circle K meetings/events 25%
 - Support for and communication 25%
 - Promotion of Circle K club 25%
 - Kiwanis Family experience 25%
4. This entry form, signed by the club officers as factually correct, shall be submitted with your essay **before the end of Registration on the Friday night of Convention.**
5. The New England District Board will judge the Tim Daly Award. Only one award will be given each year. If no suitable candidate is submitted, then no award will be presented. Failure to comply to with award criteria will result in disqualification. All decisions of the judges are final.
